I have a challenge for everyone reading this message:

For the upcoming Walks, commit to participating in at least one Emmaus activity.

With the number of Fourth Day in our community, we should *easily* overwhelm this wonderful group of pilgrims!!!

You can choose from any of the following activities. (Each of these activities applies to both Men's and Women's weekends):

- Write agape (General or personal)
- Serve a meal
- Send snacks to camp
- Attend Candlelight
- Attend Closing
- Attend May's Gathering
- Choose a time slot, and pray on the prayer vigil (links on Pilgrim's list)
- Pray in the privacy of your own home.

For those activities requiring you to be at camp, remember to dress accordingly. The campgrounds tend to be muddy this time of year. If you're coming to Candlelight, bring an umbrella in case of rain.

#### Highlights from the board this past month include:

**Gathering changes.** Post Walk has made some subtle changes to the Gathering's agenda that have brought some new appeal!

**Training:** Reports suggest the Sponsorship training has been very beneficial. If you are a first-time sponsor or someone who hasn't participated in sponsorship recently, this training is geared toward you.

Team-specific first-timer training is being considered as a formal agenda item for team formation. Feedback from both trainers and past board representatives suggests this has been very beneficial.

**General Funds.** The scholarship funds that were reserved exclusively for pilgrims (reference last month's newsletter) were released into a general scholarship fund.

**Budgeting**: Community and group-specific budgets are being built to best monitor our expenses. This should be fully developed by June. We will use this information as the baseline for fundraising goals as we move forward. **Upcoming month's agenda items**:

Discussions will continue related to community fundraising, special offerings, and one-time donations to mitigate future weekend price increases. (We are welcoming both suggestions and donations as a part of this effort).

New roles for the community will be discussed. A data administration role is being considered as well as additions to certain single-person committees.

The board is working hard to improve the community and we appreciate the support every one of you has provided to make EOEE a successful and thriving community .De Colores,

Greetings and Blessings, fellow EOEE 4<sup>th</sup> Day! My name is Lisa Herr. I made East Ohio Emmanuel Emmaus walk #55 and sat at the table of Ruth. I am also the assigned communicator from the International Walk to Emmaus Office to this community. That means I disperse information from our Nashville Office, answer questions and advise this community on all things Emmaus. It also means that I communicate concerns and joys back to the Nashville office on behalf of our community.

I write today in that official capacity to help clarify some questions and concerns about the Walk to Emmaus and its association with the United Methodist Church.

First, let's remember what the purpose of The Walk to Emmaus is. It is to strengthen the leadership of local churches for the work of discipleship in their church.

Second, be reminded that The Walk to Emmaus is an Ecumenical movement. Our community as well as the worldwide community of 4<sup>th</sup> Day is made up of Christians from ALL denominations.

Third, our roots come from the Catholic Cursillo movement that started in 1944 in Spain. This movement made its way to the US in 1957. During the 1960s and 1970s many other denominations created similar Short Courses in Christianity unique to their traditions. In 1978 The Upper Room trademarked this ecumenical program open to men and women from any church tradition. East Ohio began as a Cursillo in 1982.

The major concern I am hearing lately is over our connection to the UMC because of The Upper Room. Here are a few statements that may help with this concern. If these do not adequately address your concerns, please don't hesitate to contact me.

First, The Walk to Emmaus does not receive any financial support from the Upper Room. We are a self-funded organization that relies on pilgrim fees, program and material sales and generous donations. The Upper Room provides only administrative support such as publishing, marketing, and payroll services.

Second, The Upper Room does not receive any apportionment funds from the United Methodist Church. It is a selfsupporting organization that relies on publication and other material sales, program fees and fees charged to the organizations that use their administrative services.

Third, most all main line and non-denominational churches in the US have voiced their support for our model and approve of the curriculum and principles of our talks and meditations. This includes the newly formed GLOBAL METHODIST CHURCH. A meeting of our International Lay and Spiritual directors and the leadership from the GMC occurred in 2023 to review all materials used on each of our 3 Day experiences. The GMC gave their full support to continue our relationship.

What has made The Walk to Emmaus a success for over 45 years is the commitment to being an ecumenical organization. We commit to meet each pilgrim right where they are in their walk with Jesus, asking only for an authentic response to the strong base of Christian teaching we present. We strive to reject the things that divide us and focus only on the things that UNITE us, which is Jesus – the hope to our troubled world and our call to represent Jesus to others. We rely on the work of The Holy Spirit to work in the lives of all our 4<sup>th</sup> day in Sanctifying Grace in God's timing. We do not exist to change a persons theology. We are only to provide an environment for growth and the working out of one's salvation.

We completely understand and recognize that The Walk to Emmaus isn't the only or even the best discipleship tool available. Not everyone will want to take part in an Emmaus Walk. However, for the hundreds of thousands of Christian leaders who have done so for the past 45 years this methodology and theology has worked.

As a member of this community – one that is like family to me, I am asking that you spread the message delivered above to those who are struggling with the many misunderstandings circling about. I would highly recommend to anyone

wanting to learn more to purchase a Team Manual for your own study. It can be found on Amazon – <u>Walk to Emmaus</u> <u>Team Manual</u> for \$10. There is a Directors Manual as well as a Community Manual available as well.
